

The new intranet vocabulary

When was the last time someone told you the canteen menu was the "killer app" for your intranet? Well, the menus are changing!

Wiki

Wikis are collaborative authoring tools. Using a wiki, anyone can edit intranet content, even if they aren't a registered editor. It has become one of the most important tools for sharing knowledge throughout an organization.

Blog

Short for "weblog," this is an on-line device that lets the author ("blogger") publish short articles and receive comments from readers. Many companies use internal blogs to increase transparency and break down organizational barriers.

IM

Instant Messaging. A simple way to type a short note to a colleague and receive an immediate answer. More effective than e-mail. Less intrusive than a telephone call.

Podcast

The name was inspired by Apple's iPod® music player. Basically, a podcast is a digital audio recording that can be transferred to a PC or mobile media player. More and more, the term is being used to refer to interactive "rich media" presentations, which combine graphics, photos, animations, video, and audio.

RSS

Really Simple Syndication. Subscribers to a particular service can have information delivered directly to their intranet desktop, without having to log into individual sections or sites.

Web 2.0

The latest buzzword in web circles. In addition to new technologies, such as AJAX, syndication, content aggregation, etc., "Web 2.0" builds on the idea that users themselves should generate most of the content – a website is merely the engine that makes it work. Popular examples include Flickr (photos), YouTube (videos), and MySpace (social networking).



Who says an intranet needs to be dull? (or difficult to use and maintain?)

One of the reasons so many intranets fail, is that they become stagnant. After all the handbooks have been uploaded, it's back to "business as usual." Launched and forgotten. Would you want to visit an intranet like this? Does this make you proud of your company? Do you feel like a valued employee? Of course not!

Here's how intranet administrators can tackle this critical problem.

True WYSIWYG editing

The first rule of intranets is to keep them up-to-date and relevant. This means editing has to be as easy as possible. So, Sitecore provides genuine "What you see is what you get" - WYSIWYG editing. Seeing the exact formatting on the screen reduces surprises and eliminates the need to learn complicated codes. In fact, Sitecore Intranet Portal is so easy to use, many editors will never actually need to go "behind-the-scenes."

Let's say someone with editing privileges is browsing through the intranet and spots something that needs fixing – a spelling error, an incorrect date, whatever. With a simple click, the page becomes an interactive document that can be edited directly on screen. Click again, and the page is published. That's all there is to it. Of course, for senior editors, there's a full range of editing options, including versioning control, workflows, translation, publishing dates, etc. – all using the same familiar icons and techniques as Microsoft Office® applications. 
Superb security

Sitecore Intranet Portal features the most sophisticated publishing security in the business. The intranet administrator can assign individual viewing, editing, and publishing rights to anyone in the organization, ranging from a single field to an entire section – or the entire site. Moreover, administrators can give unregistered users the ability to edit certain pages, such as wikis, so that truly collaborative documents can be created. And at the other extreme, it's even possible to create "hidden" collaborative project rooms, which can only be accessed by specific individuals.

Put the user in control





Translation layering

For many international organizations, providing useful and usable local-language versions is a key challenge. The traditional solution is to translate a few key pages and create a local subsite, which includes a link to the main intranet. But...

Sitecore Intranet Portal tackles the problem differently by providing layered translations. If a page exists in a local language, it will automatically be displayed. If not, it will be displayed in the default "company" language.
